PRESIDENT MACRON MEETS PABLO A LITTLE BOY DISABLED AND MAKES THE WISH

HE PROMISED EARLIER TO THE FATHER

The father of the young man had accosted the head of state, the day before during a bath of crowd on the occasion of his trip to Vannes (Morbihan). President Macron's promise restores hope for people with disabilities since his prime minister Edouard Philippe promised to make disability one of his "quinquennium's priorities" persist and sign on this momentum of hope. People with disabilities represent 15% of the French population and feel a little more audible since the recent election of Emmanuel Macron. It will be necessary to follow that these promises turn into "concrete and pragmatic actions" as Emmanuel Macron had said himself during the televised debate of second round against Marine Le Pen, just before his election.

According to the newspaper ouest-france.fr President Macron had discussed with the dad of the disabled young Pablo, and told him: "I will see you". He then asks one of his collaborators: "You take his contact. This gentleman lives near the prefecture, I want to see him tomorrow before leaving." The President was able to modify his agenda at the last minute and allow time for this unexpected visit, which was to rejoice Dad and son Pablo, certainly surprised to see the President of the Republic arrive at his house.-----

It is these kind of promises held that gives hope to both the person visited by the head of state but also to the rest of the members of this Minority (not so visible in France) who suffer from being so forsaken by previous governments. ..

The remarks reported by local newspaper, "Ouest France" of Pablo's father who was very moved, explained: "It is perhaps a need for disability to change in France. It is a combination of circumstances, My house is at the right time, and place, I live at 20 m from the prefecture (Where the Head of State had a meeting). Now, if the subject interests the President, this matter is important for my child and for France, for society. Chance made Pablo living near the prefecture, but the determination of the President was certainly guided by the handicap situation of the young disabled boy rather than just the geographical proximity ...
